weak. Mark 14:38



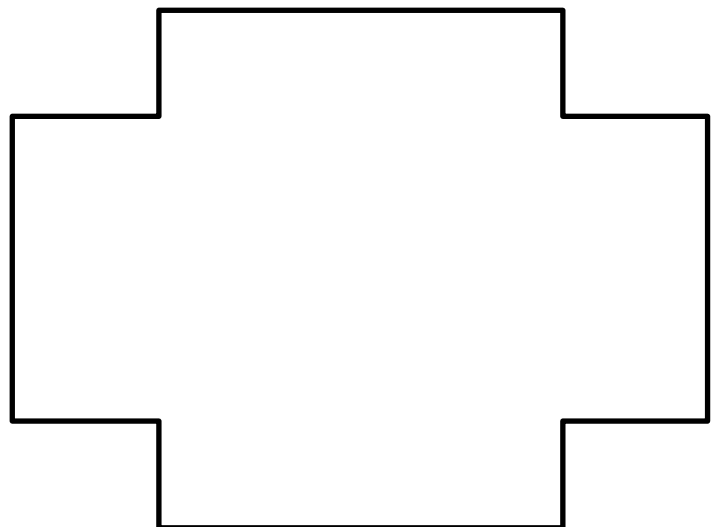

Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard lest we drift away from it. Hebrews 2:1



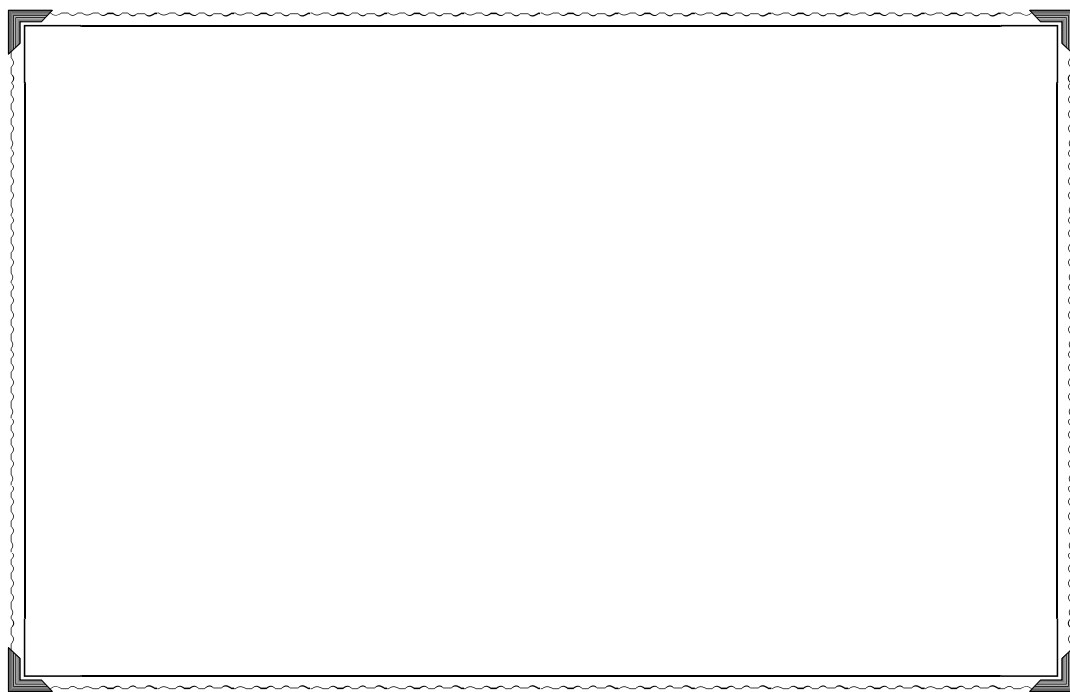
Availability

Christ. Philippians 2:20-21*



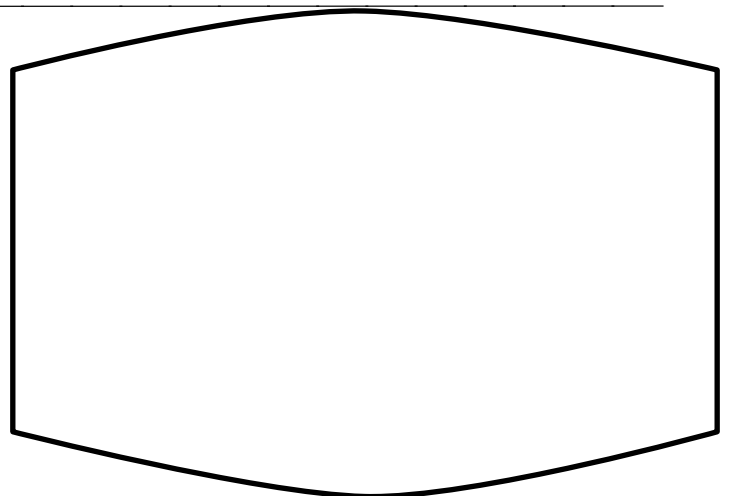
Contentment

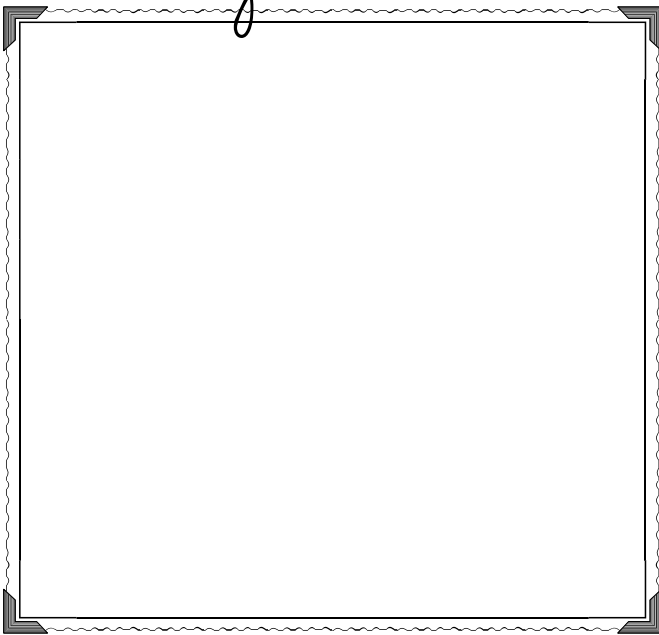
vs. Slothfulness

Proverbs 22:3



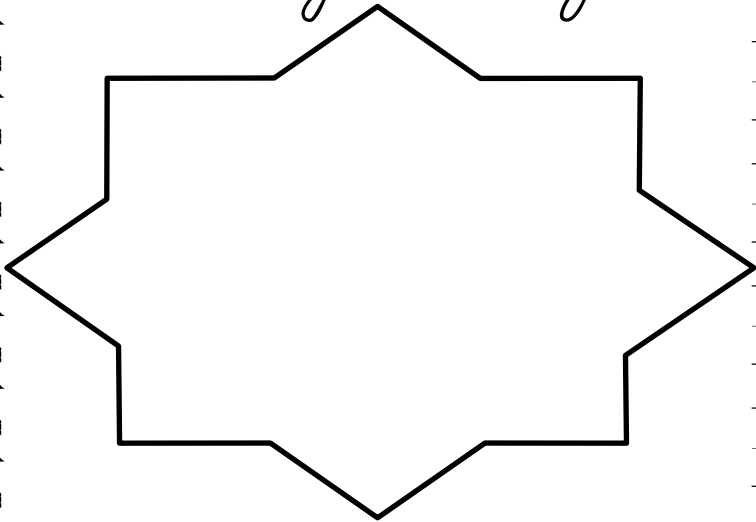

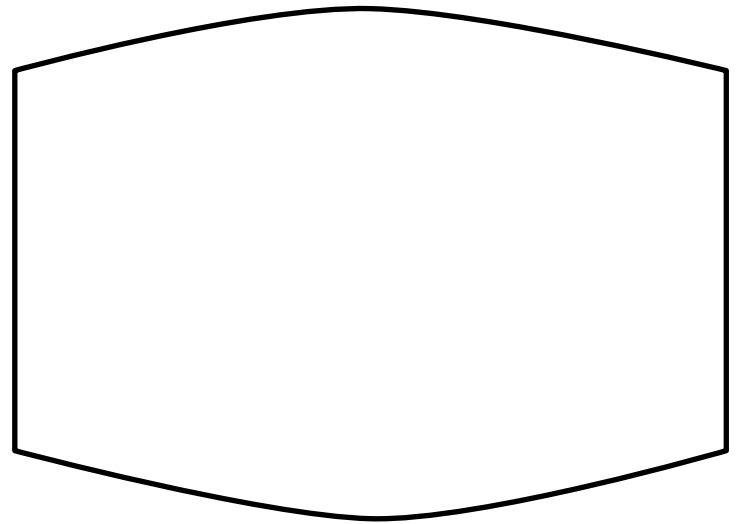

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not yet seen. Hebrews 11:1



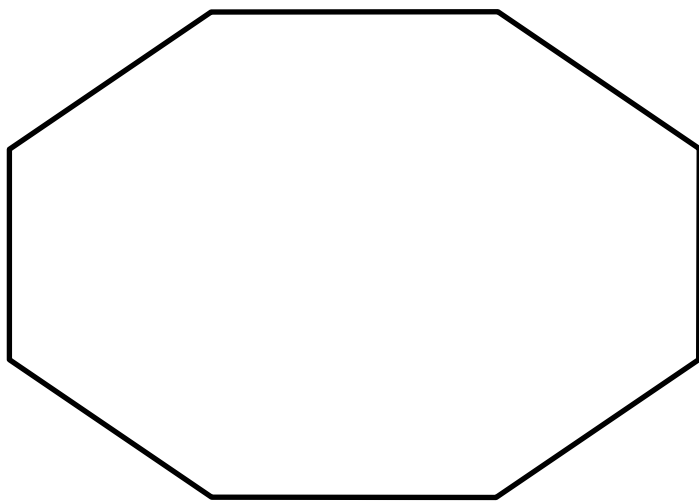
Flexibility

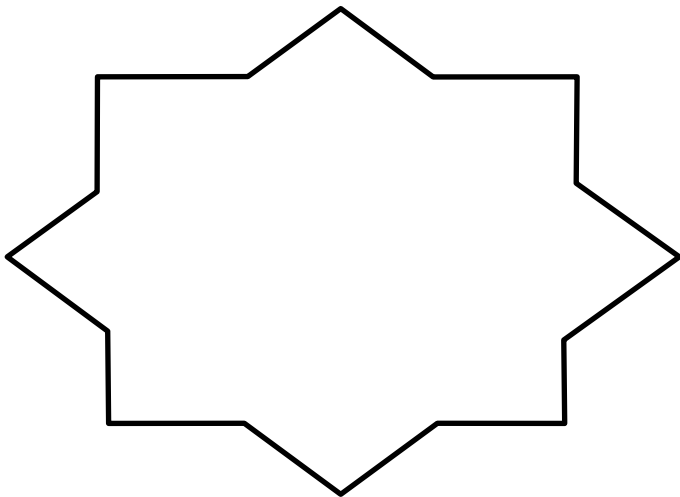

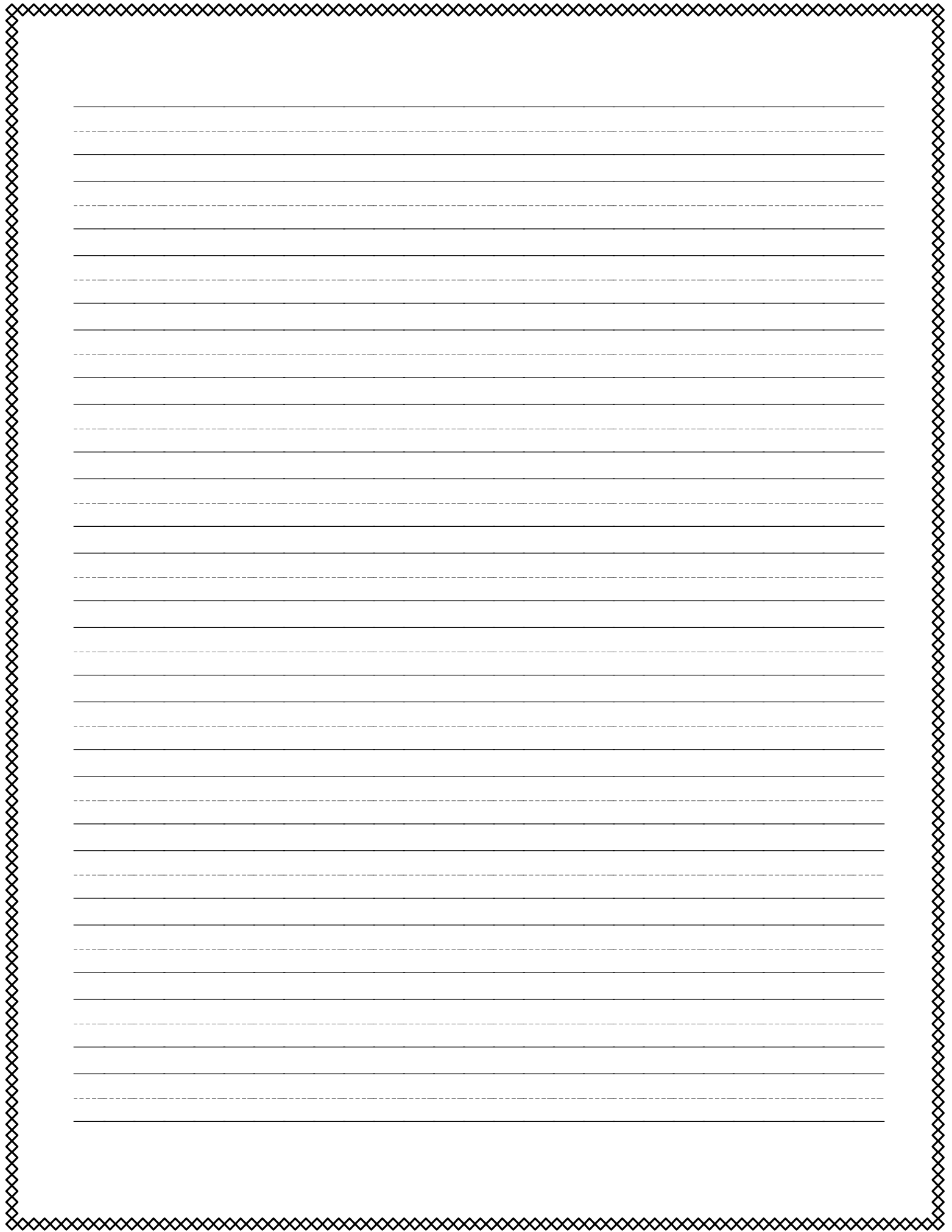

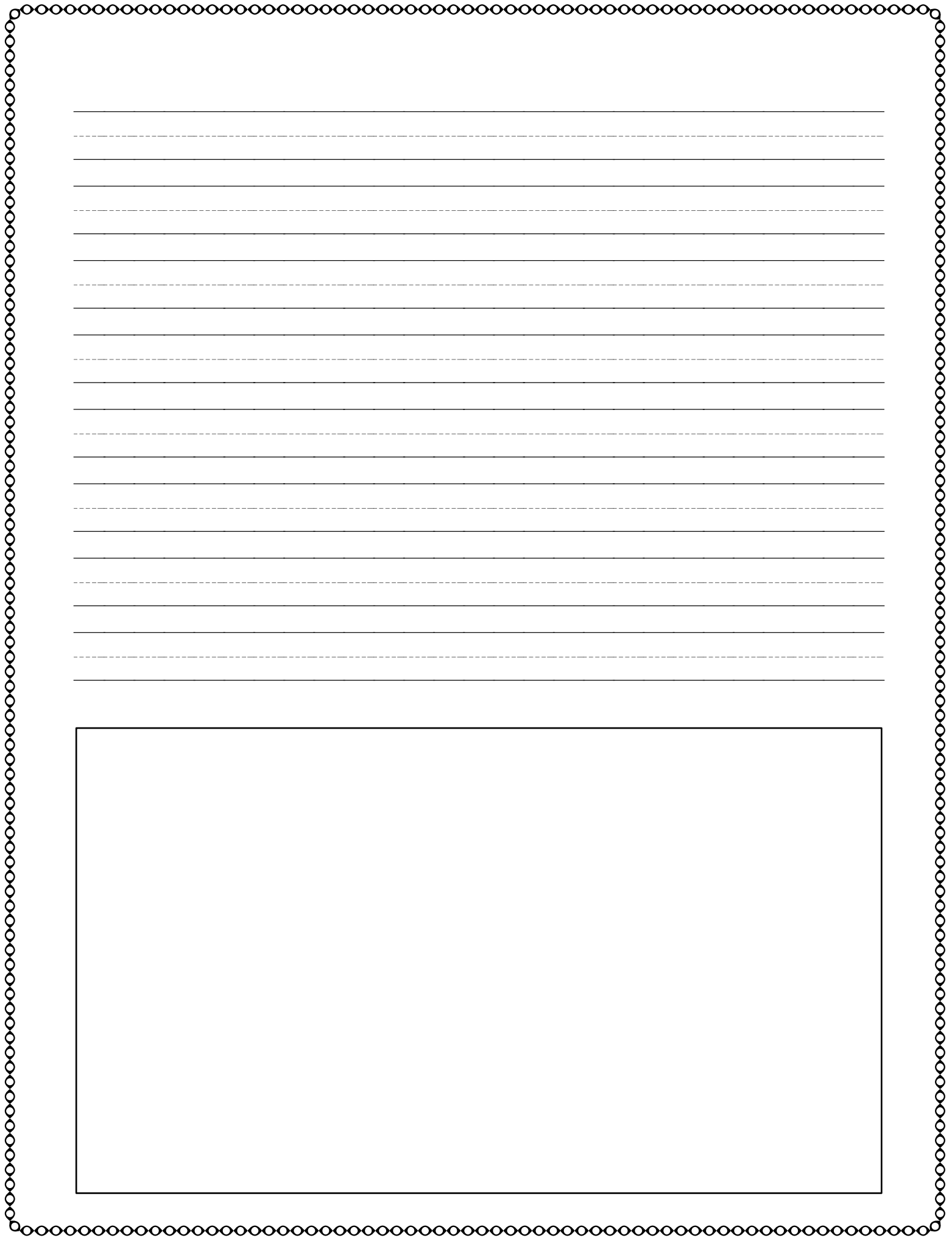
